

VI Portuguese Conference on Demography

The VI Portuguese Conference on Demography will be held in **Lisbon** on the **13th - 14th October 2022** under the theme **demographic (un)sustainability**. Population issues are gaining increased importance in Portugal, Europe and the world with the recent demographic changes, in some cases accentuating trends that go back a long way.

The discussion over demographic (in)sustainability is organized around 9 major themes:

1. Demography, policies and international perspectives
2. Fertility, families and conjugality
3. Mortality, health and Epidemiology
4. International migrations
5. Population, housing and inequalities
6. Ageing and longevity
7. Demography, economy and public policies
8. Mobilities and territories
9. Demography and environment

The deadline to express interest for the presentation of papers or posters is the **3rd of July 2022**. The submission of an abstract (up to 2000 characters) is done through the website of the Portuguese Association of Demography (<http://apdemografia.pt/>). Communications in Portuguese, Spanish, French or English are accepted. Acceptance of the paper or poster proposals will be communicated by the end of July, and the final deadline for sending the final versions is September 19th. Save the dates!

The Congress will be held in partnership with the Instituto Superior de Ciências Sociais e Políticas (ISCSP/ULisboa) and the Centro de Administração e Políticas Públicas (CAPP) at the premises of ISCSP/ULisboa. Although it will be a face-to-face event, it will be possible to attend some sessions transmitted online upon prior registration. Additional information will be available soon in our website.
